



**WALTER E. SUNDQUIST FARMINGTON PAVILION AND
GEORGE F. RILEY PARK
PARK REGULATIONS**

CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCES

Section 21-26 . Obstructing walks, drives

No person shall obstruct any walk or drive in any public park or playground.

Section 21-27 . Alcoholic liquors not allowed

No person shall bring into or drink in any city park any alcoholic liquors.

Section 21-28 . Ball games

No person shall engage in any baseball, football or softball throwing or other violent or rough exercise or play in any public park or other public space, except in areas designated therefore by the City Manager.

Section 21-29 . Motor Vehicles

No person shall operate any motor vehicle in, upon or through any municipally-owned park or playground in the City, except in areas provided and designated for the park of motor vehicles, unless specifically authorized by the City Manager.

Section 21-20 . Golf not allowed

It shall be unlawful for any person to play golf or to drive golf balls in a public park or playground.

Section 21-31 . Horses not allowed

It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or lead a horse into a public park or playground.

Section 21-32 . Additional rules

The City Manager is hereby empowered to make such rules and regulations subject to the approval of the council, pertaining to the conduct and use of parks and public grounds as are necessary to administer the same and to protect public property and the safety, health and welfare of the public. No person shall fail to comply with such rules and regulations.

- Hours Open . Dawn until 10:00 p.m.
- All dogs shall be on a leash no greater than 6 feet and under the control of the owner/custodian.

Section 5-38-(1) Sanitation*

The owner of such dog or cat shall immediately remove all droppings deposited by such dog or cat by any sanitary method.

- The sanitation ordinance is contained in the article addressing animal regulations; however, it also applies to parks.

Ice Cream Vendors

Portable ice cream containers/machines are allowed, but ice cream cannot be sold for profit. Sales will be evaluated under the Solicitors License, per the City Clerk of Farmington.

DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY REGULATIONS

The Walter E. Sundquist Farmington Pavilion and Riley Park are not intended for private use. No reservations shall be accepted for those requesting to hold events that will not be open to the public.

Activities and events sponsored, hosted or otherwise developed by the Farmington Downtown Development Authority (DDA) and/or any of its Main Street Committees shall be afforded priority scheduling of the Farmington Pavilion and/or Riley Park. No event shall be scheduled to occur on the same date, time and general location of any DDA-related activity or event.

Users of the Farmington Pavilion and Riley Park are required to remove all debris and refuse upon completion of the purpose for which the reservation applies.

No alcohol is permitted, unless special permission is obtained from the council of the City of Farmington and in compliance with city and state law.

No tents or canopies are permitted unless special permission is obtained from the City of Farmington.

Permit fees are non-refundable. A reservation date may be changed if the change is made prior to the reserved date. Permit fees are \$100.00 for residents of Farmington or Farmington Hills and \$200.00 for non-residents. Permit fees will be waived for non-profit organizations.

Volleyball and horseshoes are not permitted.

No large games such as a moonwalk or dunking machines are permitted.

Events at the Farmington Pavilion shall be subject to the City of Farmington Special Events Policy. It is expected that applicants shall contact the City Manager of Farmington to obtain information concerning the Special Event Policy as required.

No use of duct tape is permitted on the walls and floors of the Pavilion.
